Aims of the Behaviour Policy

- to maintain levels of good behaviour
- to provide a consistent approach in rewarding good behaviour
- to provide a consistent approach in responding to unacceptable behaviour
- to ensure that behaviour does not stop learning or impede potential.

Rewards

- The reward system is graded as follows:-
- Any noteworthy behaviour 1 Smiley (recorded on class chart)
- 10 Smileys Teacher commendation: (recorded on individual achievement card)
- 100 Smileys FS/KS1/KS2 leader commendation: Bronze Award (presented by leader)
- 200 Smileys Headteacher commendation: Silver award (presented by Headteacher)
- 300 Smileys School commendation: Gold award (in front of whole school)




- If all children in a class achieve Bronze, Silver or Gold Awards they may have an appropriate class treat of their choice including: class party, class disco, additional art/PE, DVD etc.
- The reward should reflect the achievement i.e.
- Bronze Party: up to one session
- Silver Party: up to half a day
- Gold Party: up to a full day

• Your class teacher will talk to you about what will happen if unacceptable behaviour occurs.






Assessment Criteria for Attitude
