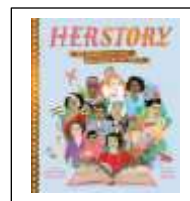


Book Week (4th – 8th March)

Find yourself a good book and settle down to reading it in your pj's. Take a photograph then send it into school with your name and class on the back.

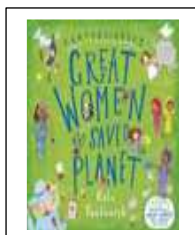
All entries to be in by Friday March 8th. Good luck!
